# PPL Command Building CPL(A) Syllabus Flying (dual & solo) 7 CPL(A) Theory Exams CPL(A) Flight Test Commercial Pilot Licence

### Course Outline

This outline assumes that a good PPL standard has previously been achieved and the necessecary command hours have been acquired.

- 36.3 dual hours including 20.5 cross country and 7.8 instrument hours.
- 10.5 solo hours including 9 cross country hours.
- 7 CASA CPL(A) Theory Exams.
- Theory Briefings.
- Pre-Flight Briefings.
- CPL(A) Flight Test.

## Requirements

- To obtain the licence you must be at least 18 years of age.
- Minimum of 200 hours, consisting of at least 100 hours in command, 20 hours solo cross country, 10 hours instrument time and a solo flight of at least 300 nautical miles in distance.
- Completed the SFT CPL(A) syllabus.
- Successfully passed the 7 CASA CPL(A) theory exams & flight test.
- A Class 1 Aviation Medical is required.







### Cost

The typical cost is \$25,000 to \$35,000 assuming a good PPL standard has previously been achieved and the necessary command hours have been acquired.

- Theory & Pre-Flight briefings.
- Navigation equipment.
- CASA Exam & Fees
- Flight Training
- Flight Test
